The Man Who Saved Kabuki - Okamoto Shiro 2001-04-01

By using a variety of British and US archival material as well as Chinese sources, Dr Mark examines how the British and US government discussed, debated, and disagreed over Hong Kong's role in the Cold War, and reveals the dynamics of the Anglo-

American alliance and the dilemmas of small allies in a global conflict.
