Dimsdale became interested in smallpox inoculation at the very beginning of his career. The publication of his The present method of inoculating for the small-pox (London, 1767: Garrison-Morton 5420) established his reputation as an authority on this procedure, and he was invited to Russia to inoculate the empress."--Antiquaria nbookseller's description.
