The Valley of the Six Mosques - Ferran Garcia-Oliver 2011

This is a detailed and fascinating account of a Muslim valley in Christian-ruled Spain at the end of the Middle Ages. Valldigna is located south of the city of Valencia and was part of a region conquered by the king of Aragon-Catalonia in the thirteenth century. Unlike much of Spain where the Muslim inhabitants were expelled or eventually departed after the Christian conquests, the Valencia countryside remained predominantly Muslim in the fourteenth and

fifteenth centuries, the period on which this book is focused. A bestseller in its Catalan edition, *The Valley of the Six Mosques* recreates in vivid and memorable terms the lives of the villagers, describing both what held them together (families, the agricultural economy) and what divided them (crime, violence). Garcia-Oliver shows the often tense relations between the peasants and their landlord (the monastery of Valldigna), but he is especially concerned to show the autonomy and inner life of the communities - the extent to which women held power within families, what the rhythms of everyday life were like, and how money, land, and labour inflected the struggle for survival. The result is a tour de force that evokes a particular place and time, but one that tells us about the complicated formation of modern European and Mediterranean cultures and societies.

In Part One Glick describes medieval Valencian irrigation in the epoch of its fullest documentation (1238-4500). Part Two is concerned generally with the spread of Islamic irrigation technology and, more specifically, with cultural diffusion and the persistence of cultural forms during the transition in Spain from Islamic to Christian

rule.

The outbreaks and collective violence arising from the tensions existing within society have long been themes in the study of British social history. This book, first published in 1983, attempts to survey the whole range of these rural riots, to compare and contrast them, and to draw general conclusions. Seventy-five maps are included in this volume, each with an accompanying commentary written by an authority on the particular subject. Taken together, the maps show how the distribution of protest changed over time, how particular forms of protest – riots connected with land, with food and with labour – altered as Britain developed from a predominantly feudal to a prominently capitalist society. This title will be of interest to students of history.

Seguint les traces de Pierre Vilar, que en la seva obra sobre el creixement econòmic del segle

XVIII assenyalà l'existència de varies Catalunyaes, la recerca historiogràfica ha generat en els darrers anys diverses monografies locals. Aquesta obra, que reuneix les aportacions més importants de la tesi doctoral d'Enric Tello sobre Cervera i la Segarra en l'arrencada industrial catalana, cerca plantejar una qüestió general: les raons econòmiques, ecològiques i socials que determinaren el seu basculament cap a la Catalunya pobra. Analitzant el règim senyorial, l'estructura agrària i la distribució de la propietat, el repartiment de la riquesa a Cervera i les relacions de la ciutat amb la comarca, els ingressos de les classes rendistes, i el funcionament del crèdit hipotecari on l'Església jugava un paper cabdal, Enric Tello explica el paper dels benestants en la immobilitat del metode de producció. Ramon Garrabou valora en el seu pròleg l'aportació de l'autor a la historiografia catalana.

Història agrària dels Països Catalans - Emili Giralt i Raventós 2008

Els capítols d'aquest volum de la Història Agrària dels Països Catalans dels segles moderns se centren tant en l'observació de les continuïtats com en la identificació dels canvis. S'hi examinen les conjuntures seculares, les transformacions dels conreus i de les tècniques (amb atenció especial a la vinya i el vi) i les estructures socials. Els autors distingeixen tres conjuntures en el transcurs dels segles XVI al

XVIII. A finals del XV i inicis del XVI s'identifica un moviment expansiu en termes demogràfics i productius que es prolonga fins al final de la dècada del 1580. Els canvis en les estructures socials precediren les novetats agràries i les diferències entre els territoris catalans rau en bona part en el distint paper que la noblesa o els sectors urbans tenen en les relacions socials agràries, en les quals la pagesia tendeix a erosionar la renda feudal. Arreu, però, l'endeutament per raons privades o fiscals engendra diferenciació social. El segle XVIII es veu com el segle de l'expansió i la formació del mercat, però també com la

culminació i final d'un model de creixement. A Catalunya permeté la formació de xarxes protoindustrials i al País Valencià la formació d'una agricultura intensiva totalment comercialitzada.

Women and Migration in Rural Europe - Karin Wiest 2016-04-08

Fundamental societal changes in the globalising European countryside impact women's migration decisions. The chapters in this volume represent diverse attempts to explain women's movements from rural areas, taking prevailing labour

market conditions as well as gender relations into account. Utilising empirical findings from countries including Austria, Germany, Hungary, Poland, Romania and Spain, this collection particularly aims to build bridges between research following the 'cultural turn' and functionalist explanations which refer to material and practiced ruralities. The international range of contributors to *Women and Migration in Rural Europe* focus on societal constructions of gender and rurality, and in doing so, address various female perspectives on rural life. The analysis of the different working and living conditions in different parts of rural Europe reveals distinct obstacles but also prospects for young women. Provisioning Paris - Steven Laurence Kaplan 2018-09-05

Dependence upon grain deeply marked every aspect of life in eighteenth-century France. Steven Kaplan focuses upon this dependence at the point where it placed the greatest strain on the state, the society, and the individual—on the daily supply of grain and flour that furnished the staff of life. He reconstructs the history of provisioning in pre-industrial Paris and provides a comprehensive view of a culture shaped by the subsistence imperative. Who were the agents of the provisioning trade? What were their commercial practices? What sorts of relations did they maintain with each other? How did the authorities regulate their business? To answer these questions, Professor Kaplan combed the archives and libraries of France. He maps out the elementary structures of the trade and shows how they were transformed as a result of cultural and political as well as commercial and technological changes. In rich ethnographic detail he evokes the day-to-day life of merchants, millers, bakers, brokers, and market officials. He

shows how flour superseded grain and how the millers overtook the merchants in the provisioning process. He explores the tension between the suppliers' need for freedom and the consumers' need for security. Even as he weaves the intricate patterns of life inside and outside the marketplace he never loses sight of the immense interests at stake: the stability and legitimacy of the government, the durability of the social structure, and the survival of the people.

Henri Lefebvre - Andrew Merrifield 2013-10-18
Philosopher, sociologist and urban theorist, Henri Lefebvre is one of the great social theorists of the twentieth century. This accessible and innovative introduction to the work of Lefebvre combines biography and theory in a critical assessment of the dynamics of Lefebvre's character, thought, and times. Exploring key Lefebvrian concepts, Andy Merrifield demonstrates the evolution of Lefebvre's philosophy, while stressing the way

The Making of Modern Colombia - David Bushnell 1993-02-09

Colombia's status as the fourth largest nation in Latin America and third most populous—as well as its largest exporter of such disparate commodities as emeralds, books, processed cocaine, and cut flowers—makes this, the first history of Colombia written in English, a much-needed book. It tells the remarkable story of a country that has consistently defied modern Latin American stereotypes—a country where

military dictators are virtually unknown, where the political left is congenitally weak, and where urbanization and industrialization have spawned no lasting populist movement. There is more to Colombia than the drug trafficking and violence that have recently gripped the world's attention. In the face of both cocaine wars and guerrilla conflict, the country has maintained steady economic growth as well as a relatively open and democratic government based on a two-party system. It has also produced an impressive body of art and literature. David Bushnell traces the process of state-building in Colombia from the struggle for independence, territorial consolidation, and reform in the nineteenth century to economic development and social and political democratization in the twentieth. He also sheds light on the modern history of Latin America as a whole.
